



The Stollery Charitable Foundation holds semi-annual granting meetings - one in the spring and one in the fall. The chart below outlines the total funds awarded to projects and programs awarded at the Foundation's September 30, 2017 board meeting. While the Foundation does not accept public grant applications for projects or programs outside of Kamloops and Edmonton, one international grant was awarded.

Edmonton Public Library Board: governs Edmonton Public Libraries, lobbies for library support, and advocates for literacy and learning.	A contribution to the <i>Stanley Milner Library Renovation Capital Campaign</i> , which is trying to raise \$10 million to transform the library to allow more natural light, triple the size of the children's library and maker-space, add a café, and incorporate childcare.	\$ 100,000
Bissell Centre: strives to eliminate poverty in Edmonton by empowering people to move from poverty to prosperity.	A contribution to the <i>Child and Family Resources Expansion</i> - one of five Early Learning and Child Care Centres in Alberta; Bissell will provide 30 spaces of low-cost childcare (\$25/day) in a new location in McCauley.	\$ 100,000
Edmonton City Centre Church Corporation (E4C): works with people in Edmonton to meet their basic needs, build on their strengths, and move towards a better life.	Funding to support the <i>Kids in the Hall Bistro Renovation</i> and program restructuring, with the goal of program self-sufficiency within three years.	\$ 60,000
Amnesty International Canadian Section (English Speaking): conducts research and generates action to prevent and end human rights violations and to pursues justice for those whose rights have been violated. Funding to hire an interim, part-time Social Supports Coordinator to allow the executive director to focus on a time-sensitive redevelopment and relocation opportunity.	\$ 25,400
Alberta Health Services: the fully-integrated health system, responsible for delivering health services to Albertans.	Funding to support first year start-up costs for <i>The Mind, Exercise, Nutrition...Do It! (MEND)</i> program, a free, family-based education program that combines physical activity, healthy eating, and behaviour change to facilitate safe, effective weight management and lasting lifestyle changes. MEND is delivered in Alberta through a partnership between Healthy Weight Partnership Inc., AHS Provincial Primary Health Care Program (PPHCP), and community partners.	\$ 47,500
Royal Alexandra Hospital Foundation: raises and manages funds to advance and support the Royal Alexandra Hospital, one of Edmonton's two primary trauma hospitals, and home to the C.K. Hui Heart Centre and Lois Hole Hospital for Women.	Funding to support the <i>ACCESS Open Minds Youth Mental Health Clinic</i> - the local chapter of a national research and service program designed to improve access to appropriate mental health and addictions services for youth between the ages of 11 and 25.	\$ 58,400
Edmonton Womens' Shelter Ltd.: the largest women's shelter in Canada operates three facilities (WIN I, WIN II, Carol's House) and provides safe housing and services for women and children at risk.	Funding to support a one-year <i>Child Trauma-Informed Services and Support Pilot Program</i> to offer assistance to children who have experienced or witnessed abuse prior to their admission to the shelter.	\$ 81,800
Thompson Rivers University Foundation: raises and manages funds for scholarships and special needs funding and the advancement and enhancement of post-secondary education at Thompson Rivers University.	Funding to support the establishment of the TRU Community Legal Clinic, a full-time legal clinic to serve low income clients in Kamloops and the only community legal clinic in the interior of BC.	\$ 50,000
WE Charity: an international organization that promotes and celebrates youth participation in philanthropy and provides international community development aid. Terra Centre for Teen Parents: responds to the issues and challenges of teen pregnancy for clients who commence services before reaching 19 years of age (24 years of age for young fathers).	One and a half-year commitment of bridge funding to support its Volunteer and Community Engagement Services program while the program expands and seeks sustainable funding.	\$ 97,300
Hope Air: a national organization that arranges free flights for Canadians who are in financial need and must travel to healthcare.	Funding to support more than 70 flights for low-income residents of Kamloops to access non-emergency medical care in major cities that is otherwise not available in Kamloops.	\$ 20,000
