Abbottsfeld Youth Project: provides programs for children ages 6-12 within Edmonton's Abbottsfeld community, which encourage the development of effective living skills, the pursuit of healthy lifestyle choices, and the connection of families to the community	Purchase a new 15-passenger van to transport youth to auxilliary programs and reduce ongoing program expenses associated with bus rentals	\$ 55,000
BC Interior Community Foundation: endowed community foundation in Kamloops that funds local charities based on the interests of donors and the needs of the community	Replenish <i>The Stollery Charitable Foundation Fund</i> , a donor advised fund that The Stollery Charitable Foundation uses to respond to smaller urgent needs in Kamloops throughout the year	\$ 40,000
The Edmonton Community Foundation: endowed community foundation that funds local charities based on the interests of donors and the needs of the community	Replenish the <i>Stollery Small Grants Fund</i> , which is used to respond to smaller, urgent needs in Edmonton throughout the year	\$ 40,000
Kamloops Food Bank: its mission is to share food and feed hope. It operates FoodShare, Starfish backpacks, and Baby Bank programs, and in 2020 secured over three million pounds of food to serve over 5,500 individuals	Capital campaign to build a second warehouse to help the agency meet growing demand for its services	\$ 150,000
Parkinson's Association of Alberta: the voice of Albertans living with Parkinson's disease and their families. Its purpose is to ease the burden through advocacy, education, client services and to support research aimed at finding a cure	Funding to launch an occupational therapy program in partnership with Brain Care Centre, which will serve to improve the quality of life for individuals with Parkinson's disease and aquired brain injuries	\$ 31,300
Adaptabilities Association of Alberta: serves individuals with special needs and their families by delivering year-round programs, in-home programs, summer camps, and online programs at multiple locations in Edmonton	Capacity-building support for the creation of staff training modules that reduce the administrative cost of onboarding new hires and ongoing professional development, while improving training accessibility for staff	\$ 20,000
Catholic Social Services: large Edmonton-based agency that offers a multitude of programs, including shelter from domestic abuse, counselling, immigration supports, immigration and refugee supports, parole supports, FASD supports, HIV/AIDS supports, pregnancy support, and supportive housing, among others	Lurana Shelter, a 30-year old first-stage shelter for women fleeing abuse, requires renovations and repairs, including re-grading the exterior landscaping and extending downspouts to avoid flooding, replacing flooring, and adding new laundry room cabinets	\$ 75,000
Terra Centre for Teen Parents: helps pregnant and parenting teens develop the self-reliance and skills to be successful parents, supporting over 1,000 mothers, fathers, and children each year in the Edmonton area	Capital campaign for the purchase and renovation of a new building that will house programming and administration; the new building is more than twice the size of the previous location	\$ 125,000
YWCA of Edmonton Society: advances the wellness and growth of women, girls, and families, serving over 9,000 people annually in the Edmonton area with counselling services, pregnancy services, disability services, camps, programs for teen girls, and sexual wellness and education	Bridge funding for the <i>GirlsSpace</i> program, an in-person and virtual afterschool program serving young teen girls that provides a safe place to ask important questions, learn critical thinking skills, and support one another	\$ 46,200
Zebra Child Protection Centre: serves children and youth who have been impacted by abuse, supporting them through the justice and healing process with a continuum of multi-disciplinary resourcess	Bridge funds to expand programming for two years by adding an additional Family Support Coordinator and an additional Child and Family Advocate	\$ 250,000
Health Arts Society of Alberta: performs over 350 concerts for elders in care across Alberta, bringing local professional musicians into care homes	Two-year bridge funding to support virtual and in-person <i>Concerts in Care</i> for residents of Edmonton long-term care facilities	\$ 30,000

Kamloops Society for Alcohol and Drug Services: regional experts in withdrawal management and substance use, offering a 20-bed detox facility, youth counselling, youth day treatment, and adult supportive recovery programs	IT Transformation Project, including the replacement of network technology, subscription and transition to universal cloud-based software platforms, the acquisition of new computer systems, and staff training	\$ 50,000
Y.E.S.S.: Youth Emergency Shelter Society: provides immediate and low-barrier 24/7 shelter, a drop-in resource centre, temporary supportive housing, temporary independent cohort housing, and individualized wrap-around supports for young people aged 15–24	Hire a Human Resources Recruitment Specialist, who will focus on streamlining recruitment strategies, building partnerships with educational institutions and coordinating training and professional development opportunities	\$ 63,700
Young Women's Christian Association: exists to touch lives and build better futures for women and their families through advocacy and integrated services that foster economic independence, wellness and equal opportunities by advancing gender equality, promoting women's economic security, ending gender-based violence, and advocating for affordable housing	Capital campaign in Richmond, BC for affordable housing, which will offer 27 safe, long-term homes for single mother-led families, women leaving violence and older women (55+) with access to YWCA integrated holistic supports	\$ 100,000
The Governors of the University of Alberta: discovers, disseminates and applies new knowledge through teaching and learning, research and creative activity, community involvement and partnerships, with an international reputation for excellence across the humanities, sciences, creative arts, business, engineering and health sciences	Re-launch Free2BMe group programming at the Steadward Centre; the program supports whole child development by providing physical activity and fitness for children and youth who are experiencing disability, with a focus on physical literacy	\$ 21,500
Edmonton Chamber of Voluntary Organizations (ECVO): a member-based nonprofit organization serving the nonprofit and charitable organizations in Metro Edmonton, it helps organizations build and sustain their volunteer programs and services through resources, networking, and skill development opportunities	Pilot funding to develop a capacity building program where established ethnocultural organizations mentor and support small and emerging ethnocultural organizations	\$ 160,000
The Young Men's Christian Association of Edmonton: creates life-enhancing opportunities for the growth and development of all people in spirit, mind and body with child care programs, employment services, housing supports, camps and clubs, and health and wellness programs	Support to help launch a diversity and inclusion audit to ensure that the organization is best serving the needs of the diverse populations that it serves	\$ 35,000
Edmonton Mennonite Centre for Newcomers: exists to enhance the quality of life for Newcomers and all Canadians, it works with up to 17,000 newcomers each year, from all parts of the world, out of five Edmonton locations and various community locations	Capacity building support to enhance the agency's fund development program, which will generate additional revenue and diversify its funding sources	\$ 225,000
Norwood Child and Family Resource Centre: located in Edmonton's Norwood community, it builds on the strengths of children and families through support and education to optimize child development and connect families to community	Re-establish the mental health program to offer individualized and group mental health sessions for children, parents, and families based on identified needs	\$ 100,000
