



The Stollery Charitable Foundation holds semi-annual granting meetings - one in the spring and one in the fall. The chart below outlines the total funds awarded to projects and programs in Edmonton and Kamloops at the Foundation's October 17, 2020 board meeting.

A Way Home Kamloops: provides housing and support services to youth at risk of or experiencing homelessness	Two-year commitment to support the Executive Director's salary expenses.	\$ 60,000
ABC Head Start: provides a comprehensive family support and an early learning program	A contribution to support renovations in the agency's new leased space in Winnifred Stewart Association	\$ 67,800
The Edmonton Community Foundation: endowed community foundation that funds local charities based on the interests of donors and the needs of the community	Replenish the <i>Stollery Small Grants Fund</i> , which is used to respond to smaller, urgent needs in Edmonton throughout the year.	\$ 75,000
Edmonton Women's Shelter Society: provides safety, support, relief and resources for abuse victims	Capacity-building funds to purchase new staff desktops, laptops, and docking stations.	\$ 56,000
Elves Special Needs Society: offers school, respite, and day programs for individuals of all ages with special needs such as Autism, Fetal Alcohol Syndrome (FASD), Down Syndrome and Cerebral Palsy	Funding to purchase a new, accessible client transport bus.	\$ 67,500
Kamloops Cariboo Regional Immigrant Services Society: support newcomers through integration services in settlement, language, employment and community connections; informs and sensitizes the region on immigration, settlement, integration, to promote the elimination on racism	Funding to renovate and furnish an existing, under-utilized space, and install technology to create an on-site Learning Lab.	\$ 48,800
Stollery Children's Hospital Foundation: educates the community on pediatric healthcare needs, raises funds, and thanks donors to give the sickest kids the best chance, anywhere in the world to live a long and healthy life	Three years of funding to support the development and implementation of a specialized Mental Health team to assist the Emergency Department staff with pediatric mental health emergencies.	\$ 225,000
The Family Centre: builds healthy families in healthy communities	Funding to develop and deliver virtual and face to face therapeutic and psychoeducational groups for adults and seniors experiencing anxiety and depression.	\$ 30,000
Boyle Street Community Services: provides community support for people with multiple barriers to inclusion	A two-year commitment of program funding to operate the Winter Warming Bus. The Winter Warming Bus delivers aid to Edmonton's vulnerable, who live outside of the City's core, where most of the city's drop-in centres, social services, and overnight shelters are clustered.	\$ 125,000
CEASE: Centre to End All Sexual Exploitation: advocates to end sexual exploitation and sex trafficking, while providing tools to help persons heal and renew their lives.	Funding over two years to support the program coordinator, who provides individualized coaching, system navigation and advocacy.	\$ 95,000
Centre for Family Literacy Society: dedicated to helping families grow and prosper; free adult tutoring and family literacy programs, along with training and research, help Alberta families improve their education, jobs, and health	Funding to re-hire an additional Family Literacy Facilitator to increase the organization's capacity.	\$ 39,000
Edmonton City Centre Church Corporation: changes lives and grows communities by supporting individuals, families and communities in times of need; creating opportunities for people to become self-supporting; and leading the growth of inclusive and caring communities, with the ultimate goal of eliminating poverty	Funding to replace the roof at Stollery Place in Central Edmonton.	\$ 32,300

Kamloops and District Elizabeth Fry Society: provides services to people who are, or could be, criminalized, with an emphasis on the needs of women and youth	Funding to support the cost of an Associate Executive Director.	\$ 78,900
Sexual Assault Centre of Edmonton: supports people impacted by sexual violence and engages communities to promote respect and uphold a culture of consent	Funding to hire an Indigenous Community Counsellor to begin the work of filling the gaps in sexual violence prevention and support services for Indigenous communities.	\$ 56,200
United Way Thompson Nicola Cariboo: improves lives and builds community by engaging individuals and mobilizing collective action in the Thompson Nicola Cariboo region	COVID Operating Funding awarded; will be distributed in fall 2020 to organizations which demonstrate an ongoing funding need and require additional support.	\$ 50,000
SAGE Seniors Association: enhance the quality of life of older persons and their families through information sharing and support	Renovations to enhance accessibility and privacy in the agency's Safe House. Sage's Safe House provides temporary housing for seniors leaving abusive situations.	\$ 99,900
iHuman Youth Society: amplifies the creative expression of marginalized young people, addresses their needs and amplifies their voices	Funding to hire a Media and Donor Relations Coordinator.	\$ 54,200
The MacEwan University Foundation: raises funds to support projects and programs at MacEwan University	Support further development of Edmonton's Queer History Project by creating a new multimedia archive and public educational website, queer history map, life history videos, and a podcast series.	\$ 21,500
FSHD Canada Foundation: exists to help find a cure for Canadians who suffer with facioscapulohumeral muscular dystrophy (FSHD)	Funding to support the ceation of a large mammal facioscapulohumeral muscular dystropy (FSHD) model for testing the efficacy and toxicity of potential FSHD treatments and cures, before moving to human trials	\$ 325,000
SKILLS Society - Supporting the Citizenship of People with Disabilities: supports people with disabilities, their families, and their communities	Funding to support the development and Edmonton-based distribution of Shift Lab's Anti-Racism Box series. The Anti-Racism Box is provides products, tools, and activities to help participants understand the presence and impact of systemic racism, and develop the skills to discuss and combat racism.	\$ 50,000
