



The Stollery Charitable Foundation holds semi-annual granting meetings - one in the spring and one in the fall. The chart below outlines the total funds awarded to projects and programs at the Foundation's May 7, 2017 board meeting. While the Foundation does not accept grant applications from outside of Edmonton and Kamloops, one grant was awarded in Vancouver and one grant was awarded internationally.
