Sun Peaks Health Association: established to raise funds for the Sun Peaks Health Clinic and support public healthcare delivery (fiscal agent for the Supporting Team Excellence with Patients Society – the STEPS Clinic: a non-profit primary care clinic in Valleyview with in interest in serving vulnerable residents)	Funding to support the STEPS Clinic to provide appropriate LGBTQ health care delivery not covered by the current physician billing schedule, including a registered nurse, overhead costs, and medical supplies	\$ 71,000
Young Men's Christian Association of Edmonton (YMCA of Northern Alberta): operates multiple recreation, housing, and social service sites in Edmonton, Red Deer, Grande Prairie, and Wood Buffalo; the largest childcare provider in Alberta	Funding over three years to support the <i>Youth Transition Program</i> , a safe, supportive, non-judgemental space to learn about community services, meet new friends, participate in activities, or work on finding employment at no cost to youth ages 13 to 19 facing challenges or requiring support	\$ 66,800
The Board of Trustees of Edmonton School Division: Edmonton's public school district, which operates over 200 schools for more than 92,000 students and provides many forms of specialized programs	Funding to re-hire a mental health therapist to support students as part of <i>The Way In</i> wrap-around support program operating out of Junior High Schools in Millwoods: Dan Knott, Edith Rogers, Kate Chegwin, and TD Baker	\$ 107,860
Youth Restorative Action Project: a youth justice committee founded and run by Edmonton youth that works with young people who have caused harm to take responsibility for their actions	Funding to support a fifth part-time file coordinator to facilitate restorative justice panels, liaise with the courts, and support youth in completing court-imposed release conditions that would repair the harm caused by their actions	\$ 25,300
Edmonton Community Legal Centre: provides effective advocacy and access to justice in a supportive environment to persons living with low income	Funding to hire a second social benefits advocate to assist residents with their Assured Income for the Severely Handicapped (AISH) appeals	\$ 149,500
Kamloops Child Development Society: nature-based childcare centre for children from birth to 12 years of age.	Support for a pergola, art station, and storage shed as part of the organization's nature-themed outdoor space renovation	\$ 22,000
Big Little Science Centre: dedicated to developing a passion for science in our community	Contribution to the agency's campaign to renovate its own independent programming location in downtown Kamloops	\$ 91,000
